Discover how to create inexpensive and environmentally friendly two- and three-dimensional art from discarded paper in this workshop. Participants will learn how to make recycled paper and cast it over natural and artificial objects to create sculptural and bas-relief pieces. The use of pigmented media and other materials on the surface of the cast paper will be discussed and demonstrated. Each participant will make their own recycled cast paper pieces in this workshop.



Kathy Levine, a mixed media artist, creates art about nature in an urban environment using recycled paper, photos, paint and other materials. She received her MFA from Pratt Institute. Her awards include a Brooklyn Arts Council Grant, an Artist-in-Residence from the Millay Colony for the Arts and Yellowstone National Park. Ms. Levine's

work is in the collections of the Federal Reserve Bank and Dun & Bradstreet, among others. She exhibits widely in the New York area including a Brooklyn Museum online show, the Islip Art Museum, Soho Center for Visual Artists and N.J. Center for Visual Arts.
